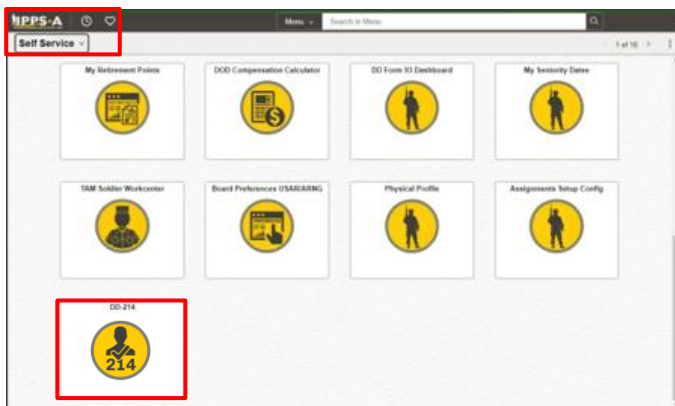


Sneak Peek: DD 214/214-1 Series

The FY20 National Defense Authorization Act, Sections 569-570 of Public Law 116-92, directed the Department of Defense to 1) modify the Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) to be machine readable and electronically transferable and include a specific block for Members to provide one or more email addresses so Members may be contacted after discharge or release from active duty; and 2) establish and implement a standard record of service for members of the Reserve component, like the DD Form 214, that summarizes record of service.

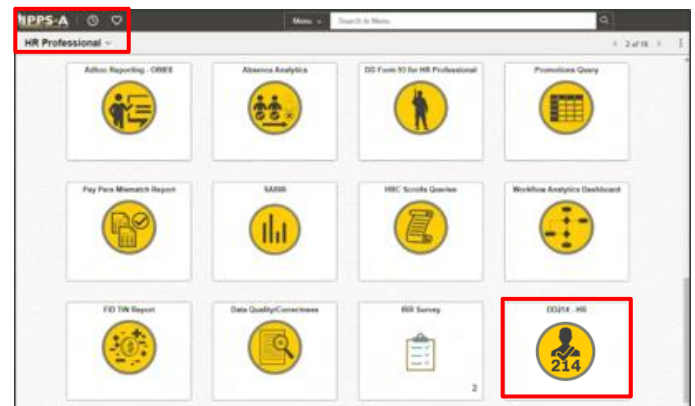
The DD 214 (Active Duty) and DD 214-1 (Guard and Reserve Duty) are coming to IPPS-A with updates for the Force! Members and HR Professionals will be able to access the forms for review, corrections, and more efficient and accurate completion. Development is still underway in the system, but here is a sneak peek to provide instructions, explain changes, and get user feedback.

With the new DD 214 integration, **HR Professionals** may review, complete and finalize Members' DD 214s ensuring accuracy and decreased processing times.

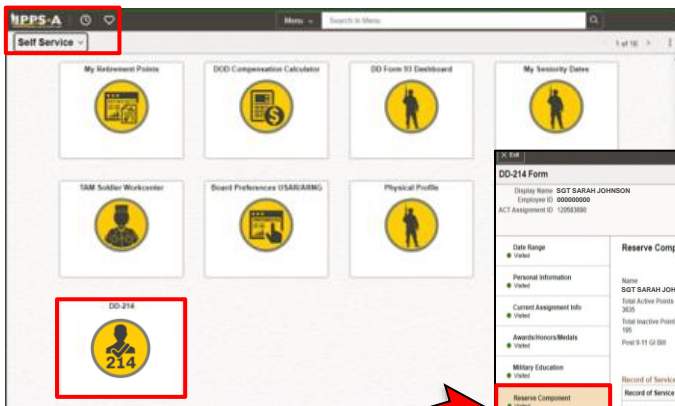

The DD 214-1 captures all Selected Reserve periods. Army National Guard and Reserve Soldiers, who are separated from their component while in a reserve status and when transferred to the Inactive National Guard/Inactive Ready Reserve (ING/IRR), will receive the DD 214-1 in conjunction with the DD 214.

DD 214-1 ARNG/USAR Self-Service View

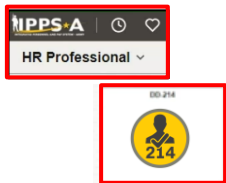


With the new DD 214-1 integration, **ARNG/USAR (Self-Service) Members** may review and initiate corrections to their DD 214-1 during the entire transition process.

For **USAR/ARNG Members**, the DD 214-1 displays in the navigation panel, as **“Reserve Component.”**
