Lieutenant Colonel Ryan Martin is an Army Acquisition Corps Officer serving as the Product Manager for the Integrated Personnel and Pay Systems - Army Future Capabilities Office (IPPS-A FCO). He most recently served as a Legislative Liaison and the Defense Fellow for Rep. Mike Rogers (R-AL), Chairman of the House Armed Services Committee.

Ryan is from Destin, FL. He was commissioned as a Signal Officer after attending Washington and Lee University in 2004. He has held numerous command and staff positions during his 19 years in the Army.

Ryan served as a Signal Officer for eight years with the 3rd Infantry Division and 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne). During his operational assignments, Ryan deployed to Iraq three times and Afghanistan once. During these deployments, Ryan experienced a wide breadth of operations including communications support, tactical patrolling, combat advising, and economic reconstruction missions.

In 2013, Ryan transitioned from the Signal Corps to the Army Acquisition Corps where he served as a Contracting and Program Management Officer focusing heavily on software acquisition. Ryan has held acquisition assignments in both the conventional and special operations forces with the Army Contracting Command-Aberdeen Proving Ground; Program Executive Officer-Intelligence, Electronic Warfare, and Sensors; and the U.S. Special Operations Command's Program Executive Officer-Special Operations Forces Warrior.

Ryan attended the Signal Basic Course, Signal Captain's Career Course, Army Basic Contracting Course, Army Acquisition Basic Course, Command and General Staff College, and the Army Intermediate Program Manager's Course. He is Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act Level III certified in both Program Management and Contracting and holds a Program Management Practitioner (PMP) certification.

Ryan received a Bachelor of Science in Business from Washington and Lee University, a Masters of Arts in IT Management from Webster University, and a Masters of Professional Studies in Legislative Affairs from George Washington University.
