COL Gregory S. Johnson has served as the Functional Management Division Chief for the Integrated Personnel and Pay System - Army (IPPS-A), under the G1 Technology and Business Architecture Integration (TBAI) since June 2016. He is responsible for leading the requirements definition, training, deployment, and organizational change management for IPPS-A. He manages the partnership between TBAI and the Program Executive Office for Enterprise Information Systems (PEO EIS) to develop, deliver, and set the conditions for successful sustainment of IPPS-A.

Prior to IPPS-A, COL Johnson served as the J1/G1 of CJFLCC-Iraq and the 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley, KS, and as the military assistant to the Army G1. His previous assignments include serving as U.S. Army Interagency Fellow at the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) where he was the primary program manager leading the design and implementation of an agricultural pre-deployment training program for United States Government stakeholders, operating in Afghanistan. He also served as the Deputy G1 of the 1st Cavalry Division, and in a myriad of additional

assignments including Battalion Adjutant, Platoon Leader, Executive Officer, Company Commander, Chief European Theater Human Resources Systems, and Strength Manager for the 10th Mountain Division and as a junior Military Assistant to the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Personnel Policy. During these assignments, COL Johnson has served overseas in Europe, Iraq, Afghanistan, and in various stateside locations.

COL Johnson is a career Army Adjutant General Corps Officer. He was a Distinguished Military Graduate of the University of San Francisco, earning a Bachelor of Arts in United States History. He also holds a master's degree from the United States Army War College, a master's degree of Policy Management from Georgetown's Public Policy Institute, and a master's degree in Education from the University of Oklahoma.
